

Gone but not forgotten, Website chronicles history of defunct Illinois high schools

The trip down memory lane back to the "glory days" of the high school years begins at the nearest computer.

WIU graduate Dave Nanninga and a staff of four associates, including Macomb radio personality Beau Spencer, have created a Web site, illinoishsglorydays.com, that chronicles the history of more than 550 deactivated high schools in Illinois.

Each school has its own individual page with photos, names, dates, memories, athletic records and events, and in some cases, the school's fight song, which automatically plays when the user clicks on the link.

"There's no information too trivial," Nanninga said. "If it was important to someone that went to their school and it was a great memory for them ... we want to put any of those types of things on there."

The site includes pages for several

McDonough County area institutions, including Western High, Bardolph High, Bushnell High, Colchester High, Tennessee High School, Good Hope High, Sciota-Northwestern, Roseville, Industry High, Ipava High, Table Grove High, Littleton and others.

And the site continues to grow as new schools are added. Nanninga maintains a "to do" list on the site that currently lists 66 schools - many in the Chicago area - that he and his team want information about.

"It's forever evolving," Nanninga said. "Once we add a school on, we'll add onto that page forever. As long as people keep sending us information, we'll keep adding on to it."

That is where Spencer enters the picture. His job is to assist in the collection of information, specifically from the western Illinois region.

As sports director for three area radio stations,

Macomb quilter steps up to the challenge

Sorrells quilt in contest for chance at \$100,000

When you walk into Mildred Sorrells quilting room, it is hard to miss the wall filled with an array of brightly-colored ribbons she has won during the 25 years she has been quilting.

Her quilts have won many awards, often cash prizes, taken her to competitions all over the country, landed a few quilts in a quilting calendar and even made her a few good friendships along the way.

Her latest creation, "Butterfly's Delight" has afforded her an opportunity to win \$100,000 from the quarterly magazine, \$100,000 Quilting Challenge, which is in a reality TV-like format. The public can participate by casting their vote for their favorite quilt.

The voting is open until Dec. 11. The public votes count for 25 percent of the total score and National Quilting Association-certified judges will account for the remaining 75 percent





he travels frequently, and wherever he goes, he tries to make time to research the history of small town schools.

Spencer sometimes meets former students in person. This past April, he and fellow researcher, Kev Varney, spoke about the Web site at an alumni banquet for a defunct high school in San Jose. The audience response was overwhelming.

"The people just came up like we were rock stars," Spencer said. "They just thought this was the greatest thing ever, that their school was being remembered even 20 years after it had closed down."

The people of San Jose also shared more stories with the two researchers, allowing them to fill in the blanks on the San Jose High School "Red Devils" Web page.

Nanninga knows what it is like to want to preserve memories. He created the site in January

2005 as a way of filling in a few blanks about his own hometown high school in Mineral, which was deactivated in 1962.

As a young man, Nanninga attended the Annawan school district - which, incidentally, is the same school Spencer later attended. Nanninga often heard his older relatives share their memories of the old Mineral High School and it spurred his interest.

Nanninga later became a state police officer in Chicago, but he never lost his love for his hometown. He began researching the history of the Mineral High school district's basketball teams, the Leopards. Because of his efforts, all six of the school's championship teams were inducted into the Bureau County Sports Hall of Fame in 2004.

Nanninga recalled the ceremony on illinoisglorydays.com. "Though Mineral is a

town of 275 residents, nearly 450 Leopard fans clad in the school colors of green and white packed the auditorium to cheer on their hometown heroes," he wrote.

Since his initial efforts were so well received, Nanninga decided to take it a step farther and research the history of other defunct schools. illinoisglorydays.com was born.

Spencer joined the effort after meeting Nanninga on a Peoria Journal Star message board.

"I've always had a fascination with high school sports, and with just the building's themselves," Spencer said. "Mineral school actually was consolidated into Annawan, which is where I went."

"We played Little League Baseball right across from the old high school," Spencer recalled. "The bell still rang 15 years after it had closed down."

Today, illinoisglorydays.com draws 100-200 visitors per day, has been featured in numerous newspaper articles and has been a topic of discussion on various radio programs.

"Usually we have something added once per day," Spencer said. "We're constantly following the local elections on school referendums and consolidations and convergences," he noted. "We're going to have to add Carthage and La Harpe and Yorkwood next year."

Updating the site is more than just a hobby, Nanninga said - it's a passion.

"Beau, he tells me every once in a while that he's at the library Saturday morning finding stuff, looking these things up," Nanninga related. "We all just really enjoy it. It's genuinely something we hope others enjoy too."





West Prairie shares pirate stories at Family Reading Night

Children and parents of West Prairie North Elementary in Good Hope came together Thursday, Nov. 16 to share the magic of reading with their family and community and to sail the open seas at a pirate-themed Family Reading Night.

Organized by members of the faculty and principal Paula Markey, Family Reading Night, now in its fourth year, is designed to bring families of the community together to collectively stress the importance of reading for the community's children.

Using the pirate theme, the night's activities were divided into different pirate islands each with a different activity for the children. The first set of islands featured story time with special guest readers Superintendent Jonathon Heerboth, WGEM reporter Leslie Swick and Blandinsville-Hire District librarians Diana Curtis and Pat Hainline.

At the storytelling islands, students and their parents got the chance to sit together and hear tall tales of pirates as the guest readers attempted their best Blackbeard impersonation.

Other activity islands consisted of pirate-related arts and crafts where the children made pirate telescopes, decorate spy glasses and dig for buried treasure.

Families were also served delectable pirate fare on the pirate ship galley that included, hard-

The night concluded with free reading time in the school gymnasium, which was decorated with pirate ships and tropical islands with different books. At this time each family was able to come together and enjoy a pirate page-turner.

But the night was not all about fun and getting dressed up in pajamas at school. There is a larger problem at the root of Family Reading Night. That problem is the dying importance of reading and spending quality time as a family.

According to the National Assessment of Educational Progress, almost half of all fourth graders and two-thirds of eighth through 12th graders read less than 10 pages per day, while the same students reported watching between three

and six hours of television per day. America is slowly becoming a country of non-readers and spending more time in front of a television and video game system than behind a book or with family.

"We want to stress the importance of reading, but not only at school but at home as well," Markey explained.

Family Reading Night only attempts to promote reading at events like this at North Elementary, but also at home every day of the week. By sharing time, experiences and stories as a community, educators like Markey hope the values taught and practiced at events like Family Reading Night not only sink into the minds of the young students but also get passed on to their families in the future.

West Prairie hosted another Family Reading Night at the South Elementary in Colchester on Monday, Nov. 20 at 6 p.m.

to determine the \$100,000 grand prize winner. The public can cast their vote by mailing in the ballot form or logging on to www.quiltingchallenge.com/voting.

The winning quilt will be auctioned with proceeds benefiting charity. If the winning quilter decides they would rather keep their quilt, the \$100,000 will go to the charities picked by the magazine. The charities are the Muscular Dystrophy Association, Spina Bifida Association and United Cerebral

Palsy, which holds a special place in Sorrells' heart because she has a son with cerebral palsy.

"If I win I would probably take the money. I would probably donate some to the charity ... and then I would keep some of it," Sorrells laughed.

Butterfly's Delight is a brightly colored quilt that was hand stitched with fabric, even though she had no idea how it would end up. Sorrells describes herself as a traditional quilter and she wanted to spread her wings a little bit with Butterfly's

Delight. She bought two yards of a brightly colored, almost eye-dyed looking fabric not knowing what to do with it. She took some designs from other quilts and ended up with an award-winning quilt that keeps the eye busy with aesthetically pleasing designs.

"I wanted to make something bright," Sorrells said with a laugh, because no one can deny her quilt's brightness. "I am into traditional quilt patterns but I wanted to do something a little different."

Before the big win in the preliminary rounds, Sorrells considered Butterfly's Delight an unlucky quilt.

The self-titled "quilt from hell" had problems with bleeding fabric, but Sorrells worked through it by soaking it in Biz then washing it. But it was this "quilt from hell" that landed her in a

challenge competing for \$100,000 against quilters from across the country.

The quilt was entered into the preliminary competition and won the challenge's hand quilting category in the preliminary round, and advanced to be one of 40 other quilts now in the running for the grand prize.

The 10 winners from





Morris said he is looking forward to next year's season because both teams will tremendously improve.

"The whole way home from the regional I was thinking that I want these guys to be juniors or seniors already, because they'll be that much better," Morris added. "We'll be able to re-group and put things in perspective."

Bushnell-Prairie City elementary receives national recognition

With tax levy ideas floating through the Bushnell School Board's head, thoughts of a referendum were thrown on the table. The numbers were not complete but Superintendent David Messersmith wanted to hear comments from the board members.

The school board members seemed apprehensive about a referendum and prompted board members to think of possible solutions.

"The tax rate is low," Messersmith said. "We want to provide a quality education, and be sure we can take care of the kids."

Many board members thought the levy should

be tweaked first before trying to pass a referendum. Board member Kent Cox asked the rhetorical question, "What if the referendum didn't pass?"

It was hard for the board members to determine which was the best route to take with the levy without hard numbers in front of them. Discussion will continue at the next school board meeting Tuesday, Dec. 19 at 8 p.m.

The elementary school received recognition when it was named as part of the 2006 National School of Character principle 10 for engaging families and community as partners with the school with Project Success, established at the school in 1998. Elementary school princi-

pal JeEllyn Pensinger reminded the board and invited the public to the elementary school craft show Wednesday, Dec. 6 from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., in the elementary school gym and cafeteria. There will be raffles, bake sales and 32 craft tables for children and adults to shop.

In other business the board:

this new technology and has been beneficial to the classrooms. He said he and his students use it to put together power point presentations. He and a science teacher use it to show the whole classrooms maps or items that would otherwise have to be passed around in a time consuming manner. He assured the board the money spent on the new technology was worth it in the long run, if the product was used effectively.

- approved the first reading of the amended board policies. There were 62 policy changes molded to fit costs.

- approved a high school teacher to employ eBay for a class project. Under the teachers' direction, the students will sell items on the Web site using real life skills. They will write their own descriptions of the products and any money raised will go toward other school projects.


Winter Solstice Dance performance starts Nov. 30

Author Jared Brown speaks at Anna L. Parker Club

On Tuesday, Nov. 14 the Anna L. Parker Club members and guests celebrated the 107th anniversary of its founding.
President Jayne Schiek welcomed the group at the Macomb Country Club. Martha Hotchkiss introduced the speaker, Jared Brown, who was accompanied by his wife, Judy.

Jared began working at WIU in 1965 in the speech department and later in the theatre department, which he had helped create. In 1989 the Browns left Macomb for Bloomington, where he was director of theatre arts at Illinois Wesleyan University until his retirement in 2002.
Jared is well known in theatre as a director, playwright and biographer. He has written the life stories of several important and influential artists, including "Alan J. Pakula: His Films and His Life," "Zero Mostel," "The Fabulous Lunts: A biography of Alfred Lunt and Lynn Fontanne," and his most recent book, "Moss Hart: A Prince of the Theatre."

Jared told his audience about how he came to write these works. While he was at WIU, he was stunned to realize a number of his theatre students and some of his colleagues did not know who the Lunts were. Because there was no comprehensive account of their lives, he was determined to write their story. He enjoyed the process so much he decided to write about other luminaries of the theatre world whose biographies had not been written, thereby ensuring their stories would not be forgotten.

Hart was a particular favorite of Jared's, and he managed to convince Hart's family (widow Kitty Carlisle and their two children) to allow him access to Hart's personal diary and other documents. Given the support and cooperation of the family, he was able to interview Hart's friends and performers he had worked with more easily. This access provided valuable insight and information on Hart's life that was not otherwise available, making Jared's work uniquely authoritative.

Hart's career spanned from the 1930s to the early 1960s, and he was one of the most successful playwrights and directors of the time. He collaborated with some of the theatre's best-known artists: Irving Berlin, Cole Porter, Ira Gershwin, Richard Rodgers and George S. Kaufman. His crowning achievements were directing the original Broadway productions of "My Fair Lady" and "Camelot."

The Anna L. Parker Club was appreciative of Jared and Judy Brown's presence at the anniversary luncheon and grateful to have the opportunity to hear about his work.
